


H.F.S.

What we believe:

- 1. We believe that if the federal government does not do its duty to provide its people with housing, basic human rights, and equal employment opportunities the people have the right to establish their own government and take the means of production from the established power.**
- 2. We believe that people will never be free without the knowledge of who they are, where they come from, and the world around them.**
- 3. We believe that no race or gender is superior to another.**
- 4. We believe that school systems should include heritage based courses in their curriculum. Because it is important that youth (especially minority youth) know the truth of their heritage.**
- 5. We believe that we can end systematic oppression and police brutality by educating our people (“our” meaning human beings with good hearts) on the law and forming self defense groups and joining together boldly in addition to boycotting and achieving political and social and economic power.**
- 6. We believe that racism is taught. People are not born hateful. And any learned behavior or belief can be unlearned.**
- 7. We believe that humanity can only thrive if it is undivided.**

Goals:

- 1. To end the systematic oppression of all people regardless of race or gender.**
- 2. To provide resources necessary to combat world hunger and poverty.**
- 3. To bring humanity together regardless of racial heritage or upbringing.**
- 4. To fix the broken legal and education system.**
- 5. To provide housing opportunities for the homeless.**
- 6. To end bullying**
- 7. To provide all people with a chance for employment.**
- 8. To end street wars and violence.**

How we will accomplish our goals:

We will host book drives, food drives, community meals, block parties, rallies and other community events that will be free to the public and will allow them to receive necessary resources and allow for fun positive social interaction within the communities. We will

pay unemployed people in low income areas in addition to H.F.S. members to help with these events, giving them an opportunity to earn legal money, learn job skills and gain job experience thereby increases the employment opportunity in low income areas. Once we have gained the necessary resources we will create housing programs to help get homeless people off the street and working or gaining the skills to work while supporting them until they can support themselves and education programs to help youth who are struggling academically because of a flawed education system. As well as education programs for minority youth to learn of their heritage and gain knowledge of self. To fund this each branch will set up a bank account and all members of that branch are to put \$10 into it monthly. That money will only be used to fund H.F.S. activities and as emergency money i.e. bail money or emergency rent money. All transaction records will be made public at the end of every month so members can see just what their money is being used for. We will host rallies and public meetings that will inform the community of what is really going on and to hear the voice of the people so we can better assist them. Once we have the numbers, we will start patrolling the police to make sure that no brutality is carried out against civilians. We do not support reckless or irrational revolution. We believe that violence is a last resort but is definitely a tool that should be used if it means helping create a better future for all people.

Requirements to join:

Anyone wishing to join must attend the political education classes that H.F.S. will hold as a “warrior in training” and must read and study a minimum of 1 hour a day of assigned material relating to political education. The material will be discussed in our weekly meetings. They must memorize our 7 core beliefs and our 8 main goals.

Regular branch meetings are held in order to communicate with the members and see how things are going and give them an opportunity to say what they would like specifically to see change or done. There is no maximum number of members a branch can have but the minimum number of members it must have to be considered a branch is 10. There will be one annual H.F.S. meeting where all members of all branches come together to discuss progress and discuss upcoming events and future actions.

To join there is a short interview process with branch leaders and select individuals the leaders assign to give the interview. In the interview you will just be asked about your beliefs in relevance to our ours.
